Unfolding History: Creating an Ancestral Timeline

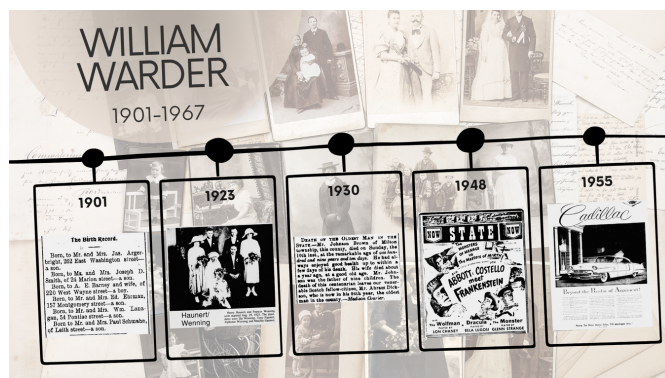

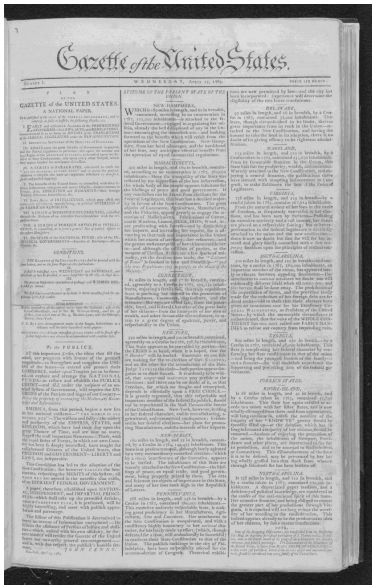

Gazette of the United States

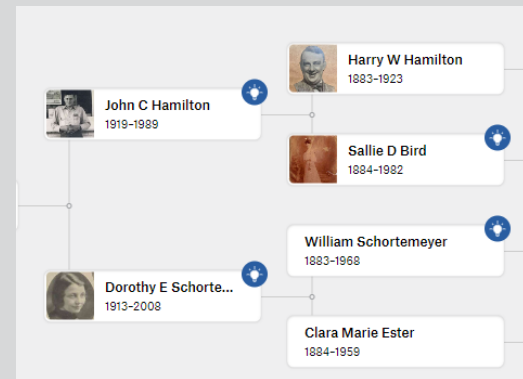
